

# Community Cohesion - Respect through RE

### Aims of the day:

The course will enable teachers to:

- Plan and deliver RE lessons for 5 – 11 year olds which actively explore 'Respect for All' with pupils
- Think clearly through issues about the RE Curriculum and promotion of community cohesion
- Explore tried and tested work on attitudes of respect for both Key Stages 1 and 2
- Provide well thought out and inspiring learning methods for work on attitudes in RE
- Apply creative learning and thinking skill RE work on attitudes of respect
